### Empowering Families, Revitalizing Neighborhoods, Transforming the Church: The Power of Connection!

Clark County has been buzzing about how caseworkers, educators and more are harnessing the connecting power of CarePortal to rally local churches and communities in supporting children and families like never before! Nehemiah first introduced the concept of CarePortal to our community in 2021 as a streamlined approach to help local churches enhance their outreach to families in crisis. Today, we are more convinced than ever of the power of connection to change the trajectory of families and positively transform the Church, igniting excitement about reaching their neighborhoods with the hope and love of Jesus. We launched in the spring of 2022 with just three local church partners and Springfield City School District as our sole agency entering requests.

Our humble beginnings have now grown to 24 active church partnerships having met the needs of 977 children and 452 adults, at an economic impact of over \$258,000! Beyond meeting the physical needs of families in crisis, local churches formed powerful, life-changing connections with these families, providing the essential wrap-around support they needed.

CarePortal, community collaborations and the local Church are making a powerful impact in Clark County. However, there is still much more to be done to ensure every person in our community can flourish.

### From One to Many: Spreading God's Word and Service Community-Wide

For almost three years, Springfield City School District has been blessed by CarePortal. Serving 7,500 students, over 90 percent of whom are below the poverty level, the district benefits immensely from this Nehemiah initiative. One notable instance involved a single mother in need of food and clothing for her children. The school provided some support, but a CarePortal request brought additional help and community connection. A local church quickly responded, delivering supplies and learning about the community's needs.

At a CarePortal community meeting, the story was shared, inspiring discussions and partnerships. Habitat for Humanity offered swing sets at a reduced cost, and other churches volunteered to fund and assemble them. A fall party and clean-up day was organized, fostering long-term relationships and community engagement.

This single request expanded into a larger initiative, serving over 1,000 people and bringing churches and organizations together to do God's work.



As the Director of Federal Programming for SCSD, I was asked to share this story with CarePortal's regional and national directors, emphasizing the power of schoolchurch collaborations. This led to further presentations, including a national conference held in April 2024, which showcased how these partnerships can profoundly change communities.

### The Ripple Effect of Compassion

Last October, I responded to a critical request for non-perishable food at Ronez Apartments. A mother had lost her job, had no other support and her electricity was shut off, affecting her refrigerator.

As a new responder for Dream City Church's CarePortal team, I quickly took the request and went shopping with my 9-year-old daughter. Upon arrival, we saw kids playing in the parking lot and noticed a playground area with posts but no equipment. We delivered the food and introduced ourselves. The mother shared her struggles: job loss, no transportation, raising a teen and being a new grandmother. I encouraged her in the Lord, prayed for her, and shared job openings and resources to restore her electricity. Her smile and newfound hope were visible.

I asked about the greatest need in the neighborhood, and she mentioned a safe place for kids to play and a way to keep the area clean. Driving away, I envisioned hosting a neighborhood clean-up and community event.

Our initial intention to help transformed into a life-changing encounter that inspired us and impacted the entire apartment complex.



Within 30 days, we organized a Halloween event, starting with a neighborhood clean-up and free breakfast, followed by "I Got The Light!"– a community event with games, prizes, food, live music, gospel sharing and prayer. All supplies were donated. We had leftover pizzas and went door-todoor, praying for more people.

We've since connected with local agencies to bring additional resources and support. Along with God, we became part of bringing restoration, light and hope.



### **Connection Changes Everything!**

CarePortal drives connection for churches, businesses and community partners to support the most vulnerable children and families in their ZIP code. Just as Uber is synonymous with ridesharing, I believe CarePortal will become synonymous with care-sharing. As CarePortal grows throughout Clark County and Ohio, I expect that soon every church will have a care-sharing team.

Here in Clark County, the next three years are pivotal for the expansion of CarePortal. As we build relationships with schools and other child-serving agencies, the requests will continue to increase. More requests must come with more reach, and the Church is vital to make that happen. Churches are the backbone of care-sharing, and every church is welcome to join the cause.

Community support doesn't end there, as care-sharing must also engage businesses and other community organizations to wrap around families very purposefully. Working together we can identify and support children and families in need in real-time, right here in our own neighborhoods.

Faith Community Crisis-Response Team Initiative The influential business leaders who founded Nehemiah 30 years ago recognized that local faith-based nonprofits - or "street saints" - needed help with organizational development, fundraising, strategic planning and administrative guidance. Today, the Rise and Build Influence Initiative carries on that founding purpose to help leaders flourish in their mission and lives.

In the cultural moment in which we are living, Rise and Build is more essential than ever. We are finding that many leaders are not flourishing. Barna research group has called the moment we are living in "the great resignation." In March 2022, their research showed that 42 percent of pastors/ministry leaders had considered quitting their job. Only 14 months earlier, the number was only 29 percent. This increase points towards a crisis in leadership. Obviously, this crisis is not confined to the Church. It is being seen in every sector of society. The studies show that the reasons for the crisis are numerous, but can be summed up this way: leaders are finding themselves separated from God, from others and from their identity as God's beloved.

Rise and Build is here to answer the horn and rally to support our ministry partners and church leaders who feel isolated in the work they are doing. Leadership expert John Maxwell recently said, "Everything rises and falls on leadership." Rise and Build is a root system of connectivity to help leaders be connected and transformed. This is necessary in this cultural moment because transformed leaders transform cities.

Discipling Another Encompass Connection Center Mission Increase Foundation Nehemiah serves and supports approximately 30 Ministry Partners. Rise and Build does this through a monthly Ministry Partner prayer gathering, weekly encouragement, individual meetings with leaders, S.O.U.L. Talk Leadership Podcast (starting in 2025), and through the Rise and Build Ministry Grant fund.

#### Rise and Build Community Action Team -Leadership Coaches and Mentors

The Rise and Build Community Action Team is another way to serve our ministry partners. This team consists of business and ministry leaders who can help our ministry partners build individual and organizational structure and health.

### Emotionally Healthy Leader and "Ruthless" Book Clubs

One of the most effective tools for transformation is sitting around a table and sharing life with others. Rise and Build gathers people around the table for some great transformative discussion around books. We are currently using two books: *The Emotionally Leader* by Pete Scazzero and *The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry* by John Mark Comer. These books press into the need for spiritual and emotional health.

### Greater Dayton Transformation Tables: "Transforming a city one table at a time."

Nehemiah is bringing Transformation Tables to Clark County. This project was started by the Maxwell Leadership Foundation. The idea of these tables is to add value to leaders who share with others resulting in exponential growth and transformation of families, organizations and ultimately entire communities. It starts with one table and spreads from there. This is what we mean when we say that, "transformed leaders transform cities."
